#### 1. Education Technology Unit: -

The main objectives of the unit are to carry out various types of research and survey in the area of school education such as school infrastructure, implementation of SSA Schemes, Classroom process, community participation and Impact study.

#### 3. Evaluation & Examination Unit:-

The unit deals with strategic planning for bringing a qualitative change, classroom assessment and evaluation method. It also takes up development programmes such as preparation of blue print of question papers framework and guidelines.

## 4. Guidance and Counseling Unit:-

The main objective of the scheme is the promotion of human development through dissemination of career information and organization of career exhibitions.

## 5. Information Technology Unit:-

The main focus of the unit is to transform into e-governance for smooth & effective management of the Dept.

## 6. Population Education Unit:-

The objective of the Unit is to develop awarness among students for possessing positive attitude & behaviour towards the population & sustainable development.

#### 7. Publication Unit:-

The primary role of the unit is to collect educational experiences, Teaching Learning Material (TLM) like teacher handbook and disseminate through print media in the form of framework and guidelines.

#### 8. Science and Mathematics Unit:-

The unit is to give emphasis on professional renewal of the existing teachers through orientation/training for teachers, headmasters, supervisors, teacher educators etc in science and Mathematics.

#### 9. Teacher Training and Extension Services Unit:-

The function of the unit is to organize professional development programmes for teacher educators including ICT and short term orientation courses on content knowledge, learning skills, pedagogical aspect.

## 10. Library & Documentation Services:-

Te Unit maintains reference books, Guide books, Survey & Research Reports relating to educational & professional development, office management books, office procedures, newspapers, magazines, etc. for use of teachers, head teachers, educational functionaries.



#### CENTRAL SPONSORED SCHEMES UNDER SCERT

#### 1. DISTRICT INSTITUTE OF EDUCATION AND TRAINING (DIET)

Under the Centrally Sponsored Schemes (CSS) of Re-Structuring & Re-Organization of Teacher Education (RRTE), the following 8 DIET centres are functioning at the different 8 Districts of Manipur.

- 1. DIET, Imphal, Imphal West District
- 2. DIET, Kakching, Thoubal District
- 3. DIET, Chandel, Chandel District
- 4. DIET, Churanchanpur, Churanchanpur District
- 5. DIET, Tamei, Tamenglong District
- 6. DIET, Ukhrul, Ukhrul District
- 7. DIET, Moirang, Bishnupur District
- 8. DIET, Senapati, Senapati District

The above DIET centres are run under the aegis of SCERT, Government of Manipur. All the DIET centres regularly conduct pre-service training programme for pre-service candidates with intake capacity of 50 students in each center. At present all the following branches are fully functional in 8 centres.

- Pre-Service Teacher Education (PSTE) Branch.
- In-Service, Field Interaction, Innovation and Co-ordination (IFIC)
   Branch
- Work Experience (WE) Branch
- Educational Technology (ET) Branch
- Planning and Management (P & M) Branch
- Curriculum, Material Development and Evaluation (CMDE) Branch, and
- District Resource Unit (DRU)

The curriculum transaction of the Pre-Service candidates is specially designed to fulfill the society expectation of an effective, efficient and sensitive teacher under the norm "ONE DISTRICT ONE DIET". One new DIET is also coming up at Koirengei, Imphal East District.

#### 2. Inclusive Education for Disabled at Secondary School (IEDSS)

#### AIMS AND OBJECTIVES:

The Centrally sponsored Inclusive Education for Disabled at Secondary Stage (IEDSS) Scheme aims to:-

- Enable all students with disabilities completing eight years of elementary schooling an opportunity to complete four years of Secondary schooling (i.e. Classes IX to XII) in an inclusive and enabling environment.
- Provide educational opportunities and facilities to students with disabilities in the general education system at the secondary level Classes (IX-XII).
- Support the training of general school teachers to meet the requirement to teach disabled children.

The objectives of the scheme are to ensure that

- Every child with disability be identified at the secondary level and her educational need assessed.
- All architectural barriers in schools are removed so that students with disability have access to class rooms, laboratories, libraries and toilets in the schools.
- Each student with disability be supplied learning materials as per his/ her requirements.

#### ACHIEVEMENT FACILITIES PROVIDED TO DISABLED CHILDREN UNDER THE SCHEME OF IEDSS:

The following items are provided to the disabled students enrolled under the Scheme of IEDSS:

- 1. Books & Stationery allowance
- 2. Uniform allowance
- 3. Transport allowance
- 4. Escort allowance
- 5. Equipment allowance
- 6. Reader allowance for the children with visual handicapped
- 7. Stipend for girl students with disability
- 8. Attendant in school for children with severe orthopedic handicapped in the ratio of 1:10
- 9. A top up of Rs. 600/- per child per year.

The IEDSS Unit of Directorate of SCERT has been disbursing the facilities and top up of Rs. 600/- to the students with disabilities enrolled under the IEDSS Scheme every year.



#### TARGET GROUP:

The scheme covers all children passing out of Elementary schools and studying in secondary stage in Government and aided schools with one or more disabilities as defined under the Person With Disabilities Act (1995) and the National Trust Act (1999) in the age group of 14 plus to 18 plus (classes IX to XII) namely;

- 1. Blindness,
- 2. Low vision,
- 3. Leprosy cured
- 4. Hearing impairment,
- 5. Loco motor Disabilities
- Mental retardation
- 7. Mental illness,
- 8. Autism,
- 9. Cerebral Palsy, and may be eventually covered, Special impairment and Learning Disabilities.

Girls with disabilities receive special focus and efforts are made under the scheme to help them gain access to secondary school, as also to information and guidance for developing their potential.

## 3. National Population Education Project (NPEP)

The National Population Education Project (NPEP) has been implementing in the State, as implementing agency by the Population Education Cell of the SCERT Directorate under the scheme of quality in school education with financial support from NCERT, New Delhi. The objective of the NPEP is to make aware the learners the issue of population and sustainable development of the nation.

## **Major Functions**

#### THE MAJOR FUNCTIONS OF THE DEPARTMENT ARE AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. To organize In- service training of teachers.
- 2. To conduct Orientation Programme for Supervisors / Inspecting officer at Pre-School, Elementary, Secondary and Higher Education in the state.
- 3. To provide In- service training of teacher-educators and teachers at all stages of school education.
- 4. To provide extension services to DIETs in the State.
- 5. To collaborate with other teachers' training Institutions other than DIETs.
- 6. To develop curricula and syllabi for teachers training institutions at the elementary stage.
- 7. To produce TLMs for teachers and teacher educators at the Elementary, Secondary and Higher secondary stage.
- 8. To conduct action-researches and school surveys in various areas of school education.
- To dessiminate new teaching approaches through electronic media (TV & Radio).
- 10. To undertake projects, schemes and programmes as assigned by Government, NCERIE, CIIL, CIET, etc. from time to time.




## REPORT OF EDUCATIONAL TECHNOLOGY UNIT








#### 5. Skill Development Programme on Reading and Writing of English

## REPORT OF DIETS

### 1. DIET, CHURACHANDPUR

# a) Five-Day orientation programme on professional development in Teaching of Science for Elementary School Teachers

Five Day orientation programme on professional Development in teaching of Science was organised for the Elementary School Teacher at DIET Churachandpur from 20<sup>th</sup> -25<sup>th</sup> February, 2015, Participants of the programme consist of teachers from ZEO and ADC ZEOs, 13 ADCs and 1 teacher making up to a local of 25 teachers from Churachandpur district. Important topic highlighted in the programme were educational taxonomy, structure of Science curriculum, planning pedagogical strategy, developing 5-E model, constructivist approach and their application in the classroom, practicing approach and classroom evaluation etc.

# b) Five-Day orientation programme on Professional Development of Teaching English for Elementary School teachers

An orientation programme for the elementary school teachers on teaching of English was carried out for the district of Churachandpur to aware the participants about the perspective of language pedagogy as per NCF 2005 and implications of RTE Act 2009, **NCF in language teaching**, self-language education etc. Twenty-five teachers from different schools of Churachandpur district attended the programme.









#### 2. DIET, SENAPATI

# a) Five Day professional Development of Communication Skills Reading and Writing for Elementary School Teacher

An orientation programme on Professional Development in Communication Skills (Reading and Writing) was conducted for the Elementary School Teachers of Senapati district at DIET Senapati W.E.F. 24<sup>th</sup> -28<sup>th</sup> March, 2015. Important topics discussed during the orientation programme included importance of communication skills particularly reading and writing, identification of appropriates reading materials along with other resources, integrating language skill and LSRW skills, activities for developing reading skills, mechanics and methods of writing in language, assessment and evaluation. **Number of teachers participated was thirty (30).** 

### b) Five-Day Professional Development Course on Teaching of Mathematics for Primary School Teachers of Senapati District

A programme entitled "Five-Day professional Development course on Teaching of Mathematics for Primary School teachers of Senapati District" was organised at DIET Senapati from 12<sup>th</sup> – 17<sup>th</sup> March 2015. Participants were elementary teachers from schools under ZEO and District Council totaling thirty (30), Main objective of this programme was to build capacity of the teachers in transacting mathematics by using activity based, constructivist approach and reflective approach.





### 3. DIET, KAKCHING

#### A. Seminar on Functions of District Resource Centre (DRC)

A Seminar on Functions of District Resource Centre (DRC) was held at DIET, Kakching for 2 days on 20<sup>th</sup> and 21<sup>st</sup> November, 2014. Four papers on different aspect of DRC such as component and importance in district educational programme, Community mobilization for quality improvement of elementary education, Role of DRC in the planning of district education programme and Role of libraries in education were presented by four speakers.

# B. A 3-Day Training programme on preparation of Teaching Aids using locally available materials

A training programme on preparation of teaching Aids using locally available materials was carried out at DIET, Kakching from 5<sup>th</sup>-7<sup>th</sup> November, 2014 for the primary teachers. Main focus of the programme were familiarisation of primary teachers of using teaching aids, acquaint with preparation of teaching aids by using locally available material.



### 4. DIET, IMPHAL WEST

(i) 5-Day Professional Development programme on Teaching of Science for elementary school teachers of Imphal West & East Districts was held from 17<sup>th</sup> to 23<sup>rd</sup> March, 2015 at DIET, Imphal West. 30 school teachers of Imphal East & West Districts participated in the programme. The programme focused on Pedagogical approaches and content knowledge of science teaching at elementary stage.



(ii) 5-Day Training Programme on Inclusive Education for Elementary School Teacher of Imphal west District was conducted by DIET, Imphal West w.e.f. 24<sup>th</sup> to 28<sup>th</sup> February, 2015 at DIET, Imphal West. The Training programme was attended by 25 teachers from different Government schools of Imphal West district & conducted by 8 Resource Persons from DIETs & other Institutions. In the programme the concepts of CWSN, Inclusive Education, Gender Equity, and teaching-learning strategies and approaches were discussed.





### REPORT OF OTHER ACADEMIC ACTIVITIES

#### 1. OBSERVATION OF NATIONAL EDUCATION DAY

The Directorate observed the National Education Day on 11th November, 2014 to commemorate the birth anniversary of Shri Abul Kalam Azad with a mass rally, flagged off by Shri P. Vaiphei, Commissioner, SCERT. After taking a detour of the Uripok Kangchup road, the rally culminated at office complex again. It was followed by a function chaired by Shri P. Vaiphei, Commissioner, SCERT along with paying floral tributes to the great educationist.

## 2. Meeting of Programme-in-Charge (PIC)

A meeting of all 28 PICs of all the Programme Study centres for training of untrained teachers (SSA, RMSA) under Indira Gandhi National Open University (IGNOU) was held on 7<sup>th</sup> October 2014 to review the progress made as well as deliberate the difficulties/issues faced by the respective centres. SCERT provides resources support to study centre through DIETs faculties.

### 3. STATE LEVEL ACHIEVEMENT SURVEY (SLAS)

In the 12<sup>th</sup> five year plan the MHRD, GOI emphasis on quality of Education, especially after 12 years of SSA & enactment of the RTE Act – 2009. The five year plan interpreted quality education with respect to quality teaching-learning, adjudicate through learning outcome. In order to achieve the vision of the 12the Plan, knowledge of learning trends amongst students is essential and also to understand the effect of intervening variables inputs, schooling facility, methodology, teacher training and students' learning achievement level in deferential subjects for classes of III, V & VIII. The findings of the survey will be used to track the learning levels and for taking midterm course correction in planning and revising interventions accordingly.

SCERT was identified as the state Institute for the SLAS by the state level steering committee (SLSC) headed by the Principal secretary, Education (S), Govt. of Manipur. The SLSC, is the overall responsible for the survey to unsure achieving the objective.

#### **OBJECTIVES OF THE SLAS:**

- 1. To study the learning achievement level often students in elementary cycle.
- 2. To evaluate the effectiveness of inputs & child entitlements on students learning level
- 3. To study the effect of intervention in school education at elementary level.
- 4. To evaluate the difference in achievement with regard to gender, location, medium of instruction & social groups.
- 5. To use the result of SLAS for formation of the next year Annual work plan.
  - i. SCERT, being as state Institute of the SLAS, developed all the Questionnaires and Training manuals which are to be administrated to School, Teachers, Head Teacher and students through workshops
  - ii. Pilot Testing of Tools & Items Analysis was also conducted in some selected schools.
  - iii. All the Field Investigators (FIs) of the survey were imparted training by the academic faculty of SCERT.
  - iv. The survey was conducted in all the districts by the FIs in the State.



### 4. Performance Indicators (PINDICS) of Elementary Teachers

As per the rules of RTE Act 2009, Sections 24 and 29, NCF 2005 and SSA Framework 2011 PINDICS has been developed by the NCERT. The full form of PINDICS is Performance Indicators which is a self-assessment format to evaluate the performance of Elementary teachers in classroom situation. There are seven Performance Standards each of which are subdivided into several specific standards. The specific standards are assessed by using rating points. The consolidated ratings are used to assess the teachers performance. Assessment is to be done twice in a year.

The SCERT, Manipur with this broad objective of assessing the performance of elementary teachers on try-out basis have assessed the performance of teachers of three districts namely Thoubal, ImphalWest (WangoiZone) and Bishnupur. The common findings of the three districts are "teachers attendance is reached upto the expected level. But other performance Standard do not reach upto the expected level. The weakest specific standard lies in the area of research publication".

### 5. Role Play Competition under National Population Education

The Population Education Cell of this Directorate conducted State level Role Play Competition under the theme of Population & Adolescence Education for students of Secondary & Higher Secondary stages of Govt. Schools on 9<sup>th</sup> October, 2014 at Multipurpose Hall, SCERT Lamphelpat. In the said Role Play Competition, Chaoyaima Higher Secondary School, Thoubal was selected as the Best Role Play Team/school for the year and participated in the regional Role Play Competition held on 11 & 12 December, 2014 at NCERT, New Delhi.

#### 6. Training of Untrained Elementary school Teachers

This Directorate coordinates all the State Stakeholders as Nodal Agency for mandatory training of untrained teachers to clear the backlog of 6583 untrained elementary school teachers of Education (S), ADCs, SCERT and Social Welfare Dept. under Indira Gandhi National Open University (IGNOU). The Programme was formally launched in the year 2014, 23<sup>rd</sup> January at MFDC Auditorium Hall, by the Hon'ble Chief Minister, Manipur, in presence of the Hon'ble Education Minister, Manipur. In the 1<sup>st</sup> Phase, 2694 teachers were enrolled to the 2 Year Diploma in Elementary Education (D.El.Ed.) through ODL mode (first batch) in 28 Programme Study Centres (PSCs).

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Another 2098 untrained elementary school teachers have also been enrolled in the 2<sup>nd</sup> Phase under IGNOU in the year 2014-15 in 23 different Programme Study Centres including 8 DIETs and other 15 Institutions. Induction Programmes for the newly enrolled teacher trainees and distribution of Self Instructional Materials and Identity Cards were also conducted with active support of the Directorate and the guidance of the Administrative Dept. The programme is being monitored by the monitoring group constituted at the Directorate level on regular basis for achieving quality in teacher education.

#### 6. Inclusive Education for Disabled at Secondary Stage (IEDSS)

During the year 2014-15, the number of CWSN (Children with Special Needs) covered were 430 disabled children in 109 Schools. The children were provided Books & Stationery allowances, Uniform allowances, Transport and escort allowances, Stipend of Girls with disability and Reader allowance of Blind Children. The State Government also provided as Top-Up of Rs. 600/- for each Disabled child.

iv) Kasom Khullen - Ukhrul District


v) Kangpokpi - Senapati District

### III. ESTABLISHMENT OF COLLEGE OF TEACHERS EDUCATION (CTE)

SCERT is proposing to the Government of India to set up New College of Teachers Education in the hill districts of Manipur where there are no such institutions at present. The Government of India has agreed to appraise to the establishment of 2 CTEs in the first phase.

This is envisaged to provide the requirement of B.Ed/ M.Ed training to meet the requirement of trained teachers in the hill districts of the State.

## PLANNING AND MANAGEMENT

Planning Unit of SCERT, by virtue of its nature of work is responsible for formulation of long term and short term development policies of the Department. Formulation of Five Year Annual Plan and Annual Work Programme, determination of priorities among the activities, etc. are done by the Planning Unit.

The Unit coordinated different Units in the Department in the formulation of State/Central Plan Schemes.

The Unit also prepares Annual Budget for the Department which is included in the Demands of Grants of the State Government.

Management is an important element in every Department. It is the element that coordinates current Departmental activities and plans for the future. Hence, the SCERT, Manipur also conducts various academic activities such as Research Works, Action Research, Workshops, Short Term Orientation Programmes, Teacher Education, Seminars, etc. with a proper planning and management.
